## ***How to use it***

*Both of the sentences you have learnt today, will show your conversation partner that you understand what he/she is saying, that you are interested and that you want him/her to tell more!*

## ***Pronunciation highlights***

Det	<i>is pronounced</i>	De´
Jeg	<i>is pronounced</i>	Jah´
Rigtigt	<i>is pronounced</i>	Regdeed

## ***Learn, remember and use it forever!***

***First...*** Create flash cards! One for each word from the 'New words list' and one for each whole phrase. A flash card is a piece of cardboard with Danish on one side and English on the other. Or you can download the free software Anki, and make electronic flash cards. The program will space your repetitions for you according to how well you have learned each card. Download Anki: <http://ichi2.net/anki/>

(Don't make cards from the 'Break down of the phrase', just one card for each whole phrase.)

***Then...*** Flip through your flash cards many times a week. Preferably every day.

***And finally...*** Use these expressions whenever you have the chance. Never mind if you are having a conversation in English. Just go ahead and speak your Danish phrases! The reactions you get will probably be positive. Some people might even want to tell you other things you could also say in Danish. And just like that, you are having a real life language class – for free and without sitting for hours in a class!
