## **Learn, remember and use it forever!**

**First...** Create flash cards! A flash card is a piece of cardboard with Danish on one side and English on the other. Or you can download the free software Anki, and make electronic flash cards. The program will space your repetitions for you according to how well you have learned each card.

It's fine to make cards with single words, just make sure also to do one card for each whole phrase. This is important.

**Then...** Flip through your flash cards many times a week. Preferably every day.

**And finally...** Use these expressions whenever you have the chance. Never mind if you are having a conversation in English. Just go ahead and speak your Danish phrases! People will love you for it. Trust me!
